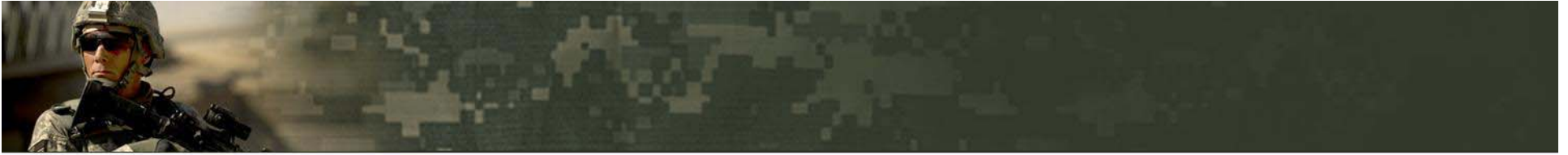

Full Spectrum Operations (FSO)

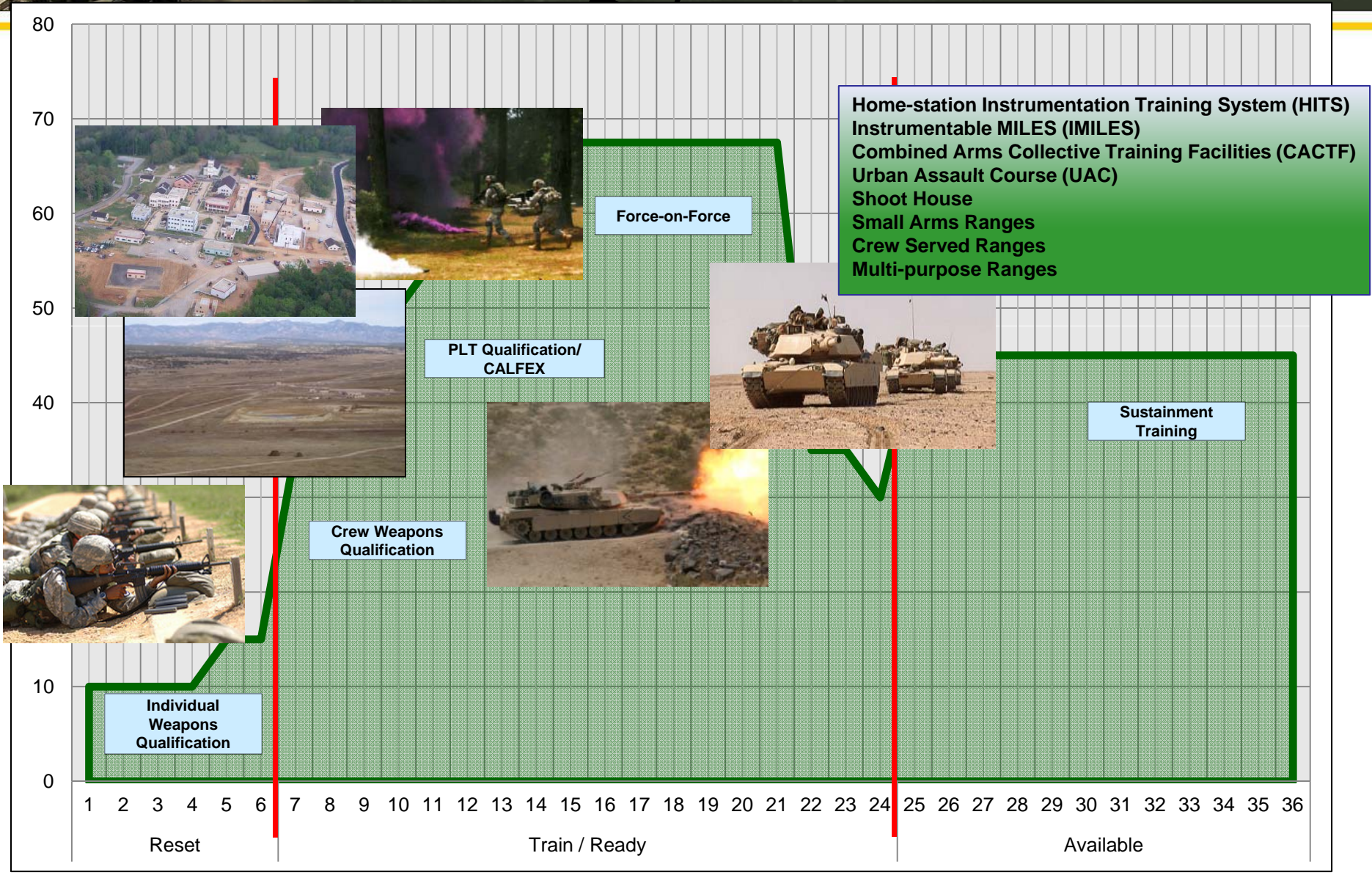


Background

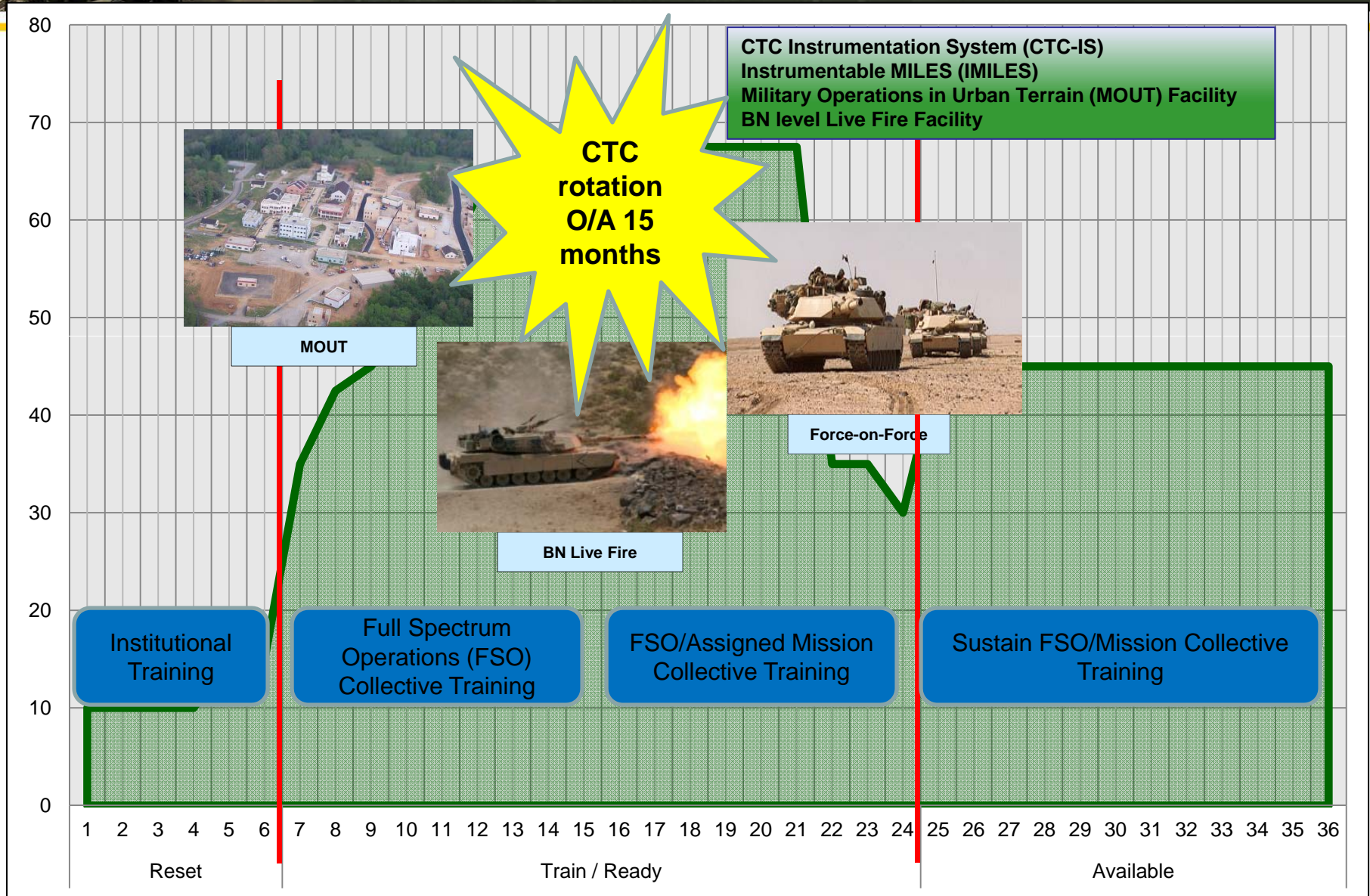
- **The Army's training approach has used the Mission Rehearsal Exercise (MRE) concept and has been focused on the Counter-Insurgency (COIN) fight for the last 10 years**
 - **FSO is NOT new, but conducting offensive, defensive, and stability operations sequentially and simultaneously has not been trained in the past**

Phased Strategy

Today

Focus on combat operations. CTCs and HS MRE focused. FSO training rarely possible. **CTCs build OE scenarios to fit unit and theater needs.**

“CTC Unique”

- Each CTC uses local assets to develop a scenario and surrounding OE conditions that reflect the training needs of the rotational unit and/or theater requirements.

Near Term

Army is in “reset”, opportunity for FSO training-Hybrid Threat increasing, time still constrained (**1:2/1:4 dwell time**)

Common Scenario

- “X Bde Xth Division as a part of Yth Corps deploys to Country BLUE to deter conflict and if conflict occurs conduct combat operations...”
 - **Enemy OB, ethnic groups, OE variables largely the same** across CTCs and HS.

Mid Term

“Era of persistent conflict” continues, all units undergo FSO training and then MRE for specific missions. **Dwell time exceeds 1:2/1:4.**

Common Operational Environment

- A fictitious region with **PMESII connections** between all CTCs
 - Actions at one CTC may have “effects” on other CTC
 - Ethnic/religious/ideology **unique** to each CTC but there is **cross over** between CTCs.
 - Global OE with differing manifestations of the variables at each CTC.

PM TRADE implements new internal processes as a result of Tiger Team findings. After four months of analyzing our processes, conducting post mortem reviews of past and current programs, surveying our workforce, and listening to industry comments we are implementing a broad spectrum process that encompasses four key acquisition planning mission areas: Requirements Planning, Technical and Logistics Planning, Acquisition Planning, and Requirements Analysis. The PM TRADE Process Map facilitated by the Strategic Requirements Integration Team targets Process, Product, and Organizational improvements.
