
Yearly sources for requirements and new capabilities flow into the software baseline.




- Government-owned, open-source software; Government retains all software rights
- Government acts as the Lead System Integrator
- ► Requirements Prioritization Process with participation of M&S communities
- Product line approach:
  - Provide a configurable software architecture that enables third party (co-developer process) customization
  - Allow user community to modify, create, or extend models and behaviors, performance data, entities and units, and tools
- Standards-based software development; implements DoD/Industry-based standards
- ► Centralized Configuration Management
- Centralized development location; Government and contractors are co-located, executing as one Integrated Product Team
- Controlled software distribution; Distribution Agreement requires recipients to share software enhancements with APM OneSAF for integration and distribution
- Minimize/eliminate duplication of efforts Build once, reuse often!!
