## MR. TIMOTHY F. BISHOP, SES



Mr. Timothy F. Bishop is the Acting Program Executive Officer for the Program Executive Office, Simulation, Training and Instrumentation (PEO STRI). On January 20, 2019, Mr. Bishop was selected for the Senior Executive Service and appointed to the position of Deputy Program Executive Officer for PEO STRI. Mr. Bishop manages a portfolio of fielded systems with a current inventory value of over \$2.65B in 125 locations; over 335,000 training devices in 19 foreign countries; and 480 sites worldwide. He evaluates proposed program plans of subordinate managers in light of current technology; Army research, development, and engineering needs; and program thrusts.

## COLONEL G. SCOTT MCLEOD



Colonel G. Scott McLeod enlisted in the Army in 1993 and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Adjutant General's Corps from the U.S. Army Officer Candidate School, Fort Benning, Georgia in 1994. His first duty assignment was with the 556th Personnel Services Battalion, 25th Infantry Division (Light), Schofield Barracks, Hawaii where he served in a variety of duty positions including Chief of Personnel Automation; Chief, Joint Reception Center Operation Uphold Democracy (Haiti); Battalion S4; Commander, Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment

and Battalion S3.

After duty as an instructor for the Adjutant General Officer Basic Course and as Commander, Company A, Training Support Battalion, Fort Jackson, South Carolina, he transitioned to the Army Acquisition Corps, attended graduate school and participated in Training with Industry program at Lockheed Martin Missiles and Fire Control, Dallas, Texas.

His assignments in the Acquisition Corps include Assistant Product Manager (APM) Test and Evaluation for the Aviation Rockets and Missiles Project Office; APM Advanced Precision Kill Weapon System (APKWS); APM Patriot Advanced Capability-3 (PAC-3) Missile Segment and Executive Officer, Program Executive Office Missiles and Space; Department of the Army System Coordinator (DASC) for Cruise Missile Defense Systems, later Deputy Director of Operations Operation Enduring Freedom, Assistant Secretary of the Army for Acquisition Logistics and Technology; Operations Officer, Program Office Field Operations and Support, Program Executive Office Simulation, Training and Instrumentation and Product Manager, Enhanced Command and Control, Battle Management and Communications, Missile Defense Agency. Most recently Colonel McLeod served as Chief of Staff, Operational Integration Office, Mission Integration Directorate, National Reconnaissance Office.

Colonel McLeod holds a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, a Master of Public Administration degree from the University of South Carolina and Master of Business Administration degree from the University of Texas at Arlington.

He is a member of the Army Acquisition Corps and certified Level III in Program Management and Level I in Test and Evaluation.

## COLONEL CORY N. BERG



Colonel Cory N. Berg recently arrived at PEO STRI to become the Program Manager for Soldier Training. His most recent assignment was as the Military Deputy at the U.S. Army Combat Capabilities Development Command (CCDC) Chemical Biological Center, Aberdeen Proving Grounds, Maryland, working with JPEO CBRND and Army Futures Command, to deliver detection, prevention and decontamination technology for the Joint Chemical and Biological Defense Program.

Colonel Berg graduated from the U.S. Army War College in June 2019 with a Master's degree in Strategic Studies. Prior to attending the War College, he was the Product Manager Applique and Large Unmanned Ground Systems (ALUGS) in Warren, Michigan from 2015 - 2018. In ALUGS, he oversaw the procurement of autonomy and robotic technologies to carry Soldier load, automate convoys, and remote control both IED and mine clearing equipment for Warfighters.

Colonel Berg served at the National Reconnaissance Office as a Deputy Project Manager for Joint Intelligence programs from 2012 - 2015, where he managed classified satellite acquisition programs and services that provided intelligence to Warfighters. He also served as a Department of Army Systems Coordinator (DASC) in the Pentagon from 2010 - 2012 for JPEO Chemical Biological Defense systems, and Patriot Missile systems.

From 2005 to 2010 Colonel Berg participated in the Training with Industry program at General Dynamics Land Systems in Sterling Heights, Michigan, served as the Executive Officer for PEO Ground Combat Systems (GCS), the M1A2 SEP Abrams Tank Assistant Product Manager, and as an acquisition manager in the TACOM Reset and Modularity office.

Prior to becoming an Acquisition Officer, Colonel Berg served as an Ordnance Maintenance Officer at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, from 2001 to 2005, and Fort Riley, Kansas from 1997 to 2000. He is originally from North Dakota and has a Bachelor's degree in Agricultural Engineering.

## PM ST HISTORY

Project Manager Soldier Training (PM ST) traces its heraldry back to Project Manager Training Devices, or PM TRADE, which was established on 23 December 1974. In the late 1980s, PM TRADE moved to its current location with the Navy in Research Park, Orlando, Florida.

On 5 May 1992, PM TRADE became part of the newly activated U.S. Army Simulation, Training and Instrumentation Command (STRICOM), joining forces with Project Manager Combined Arms Tactical Trainer (PM CATT) and Project Manager Instrumentation, Targets and Threats Simulators (PM ITTS) to provide the best simulation, instrumentation and training for the U.S. military forces.

In June 1999, the STRICOM Commanding General ordered a re-organization. As part of that re-organization effort, PM TRADE divided the responsibilities of PM LTS and formed the Product Management Office for Combat Training Instrumentation Systems (PM CTIS) and added the Product Management Office for Digitized Training (PM DT).

In October 2019, PM TRADE was reflagged to create PM Soldier Training (PM ST) and the PM portfolio expanded to include virtual collective training capabilities as well as the next generation Synthetic Training Environment edge devices. Over time, the PM shop's portfolio has evolved and changed, but the mission remains to provide live and virtual simulation training products and systems designed to support and enable training readiness at homestations, the Combat Training Centers and while deployed. PM ST remains the Department of the Army Executive Agent for all Instrumentation and Tactical Engagement Simulation Systems at the Maneuver Combat Training Centers.

PM ST's formation includes the Product Manager Live Training Systems; Product Manager Combat Training Instrumentation Systems; Product Manager Virtual Training Systems; Product Manager Maneuver Collective Training Systems; and Product Director Future Training Solutions. Almost 300 heroes and heroines work together with PM ST's stakeholders and industry partners to sharpen the very tip of the spear.
